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FROM THE DESK OF MRS. SMITH, PRINCIPAL GASKILL PREP SCHOOL

Dear Parents/Guardians and Students:

It's warming up a bit, and the school year is winding down. After returning from spring break, testing will take place one (1) day later. Spring Break this year is from March 21st through April 1st. Students will return on Monday, April 4th and New York State ELA testing will begin on Tuesday, April 5^{th.}

It is important that as we enter this critical period of time, students need to be attending school daily and are at their academic best. As you know, test results will be used to determine each student's level of need. Please know that the test is not an indicator of a student's aptitude ability, and merely indicates a student's performance and track level, and what the student is ready for.

Student Performance Level	Student Track	Student Readiness
Level 3 and Level 4	High Level	College and Career ready on Common Core Regents Exams for graduation
Level 2	Passing Level	On track to score the passing level for gradu- ation on Common Core Regents Exams
Level 1	Needs Level	Requires additional supports to address student needs early enough to meet graduation requirements

These assessments based on the Common Core State Standards benefit students in many ways. For example, *test* scores help us to monitor and continuously evaluate our district instructional programs such as the **Accelerated/CAP programs** in order to provide the best academic programs as possible for our students.

Scores are used to:

- inform instruction in the classroom
- address student needs and strengths
- expose student to the learning content
- prepare student to succeed in high school

Scores are not used for:

- student grades
- teacher evaluation
- student promotion

NOTE: *This year's test will have fewer passages and questions and will not be timed.

<u>It is important that students participate in the upcoming 3-8 assessments!</u> Even more important at the Prep level as opposed to the elementary level, taking the test prepares our students for taking the Regents exams which ALL students are required to pass in order to graduate from high school.

Taking the NYS ELA and math assessments during Grades 7 and 8 serves as practice for the Regents exams. Test taking consists of skills using strategies which helps students improve their scores. The more a student is familiar with strategies and format, the more a student is comfortable with test taking and will do better on the Prep level and Regents test, yielding better results. <u>Our children are less than two (2) years away from attending high school and are being prepared for the next and final phase of their secondary education – high school graduation. If your child is not familiar with graduation requirements, please share with your child the requirements as shown below.</u>

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- A.) Students must complete and pass the following <u>courses</u> as part of the district's graduation requirements:
- \Rightarrow English 4 credits
- ⇒ Social Studies 4 credits
- \Rightarrow Mathematics 4 credits
- \Rightarrow Science 4 credits
- \Rightarrow Art or Music 1 credit
- \Rightarrow Physical Education 2 credits (0.5 unit each year for 4 years)
- \Rightarrow Second Language 1 credit
- \Rightarrow Health 0.5 credit
- \Rightarrow Electives 1.5 credits

B.) Students must also earn a 65% or higher on 5 of the following **Regents Exams** as part of the district's graduation requirements:

Traditional Pathway	Alternative Option
1. Integrated Algebra/Common Core	One Math (e.g. Integrated Algebra/Common Core)
2. Living Environment	One Science (e.g. Living Environment)
3. Global History/Geography	One Social Studies (Global History and Geography or U.S. History and Government
4. Comprehensive English/Common Core	Comprehensive English/Common Core

5. One Pathway Assessment: (Sequence examination in Science (Earth Science) or sequence examination in Math (Geometry).

If you wish to not have your child take the state assessments, please notify our Main Office in writing, no later than Wednesday March 30th. Please indicate your child's name, grade and your contact phone number.
