
- SCHOOL BEGINS AT 7:30

Please ask your children about their school supply situation! Many of the pens and pencils purchased in September are LONG GONE, and many students are coming to class needing to borrow a pen or pencil.





SCHOOL SUPPLIES



We are now into the 2nd half of the school year. Please remember to replenish your child's school supplies as needed. Pencils, pens, loose leaf paper, tissues are a few of the supplies that are used daily in school.

SOME TIPS ABOUT HOW NOT TO BE LATE TO SCHOOL!

With the Winter weather coming, here are some good tips on how to get to school on time:

- Prepare the clothes you want to wear the night before and have them laid out.
- Go to bed EARLIER!
- Do not sleep with the TV, radio, etc. playing. This will interrupt your good sleep!
- Set your alarm clock to get up 15 minutes earlier.

FROM THE NURSE:

New York State requires physicals for all students in 7th grade as well as any student that was a new enter from another school district. A doctor's physical done after 9/1/2013 is acceptable. Please send a copy into the clinic. School physicals will begin in February and are done by the district Nurse Practitioner. If you do not want your child top receive a school physical, please call the school nurse with a doctor's appointment date.



There are dates set for spring sport physicals. If your child plans to participate in a spring sport, they need to stop into the clinic and sign up for an appointment ASAP.


For their safety and well being, children who are ill in school should be seen in the clinic. We need to determine the extent of their illness or if they will need to be referred to a doctor. If your child calls or texts you that they are sick and need to go home, please ask them to go to the nurse and we will call you from the clinic. If they are not seen in the clinic, they will need to be signed out through the main office.

New York State requires screening for vision, hearing and scoliosis be done on all 7th graders and scoliosis be checked on all 8th graders. If you receive a referral, please have your child seen by their doctor for follow up and return the referral to the school nurse.

The goal in the Health Office is to try to ensure the safety and well being of your child when in school. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact us.
