### Students are not allowed to enter school before 8:45am unless participating in the

**breakfast program.** The breakfast program begins daily at 8:25am. Students are to enter through Door #5. All other students will be asked to wait outside until the first bell rings at 8:45.



Please remember, phone calls are **NOT** put through to classrooms during the instructional day for any reason unless it is an absolute emergency. Parents will be directed to the teacher's voice mail to leave a message.





## IN CASE OF SNOW

If schools must be closed due to inclement weather or other emergencies, parents and students will be notified in the early morning, or if possible, the evening before by radio, television and/or telephone messages. The TV and Radio stations notified are:

WEBR AM 970, WJJL AM 1440, WHLD 1270, WGR AM 55, WBLK FM 93.7, WYRK FM 106.5, WBEN AM 930, WKSE FM 98.5, WGRZ TV (CH 2), WIVB TV (CH 4) WKBW TV (CH 7) AND OSC CHANNEL 21 ON TIME WARNER CABLE.

The Delayed start plan allows time for weather conditions to change so school attendance is possible. This may also allow for temperatures to rise and clearing of roadways and sidewalks. If a delayed start is called, school will begin at 10:45 am. Breakfast will be served and lunch will be served at the usual time. Dismissal times will remain the same as any usual school day.

Does your child find it hard to do homework? Are there a lot of distractions? Below you will find some helpful tips on how to create homework space that will promote a healthy and happy student!




Create a special homework place for your child that is quiet and has good lighting (No TV or cell phones). Make it a place with all of the necessary school supplies.
