Disciplinary Procedures for unauthorized use of cellular telephones/wireless communication devices:

- Immediate confiscation of the cellular telephone/wireless communication device from the student.



This was another step the school has taken to improve safety around the building. Last fall, a new crosswalk area with a traffic yield sign were installed near the east end of the school.





IMPORTANT NEWS FOR PARENTS FOR 2017/2018 SCHOOL YEAR

FROM THE NURSE:

With the beginning of fall and the change of season, we see many viral infections in children. Signs of these could be a runny nose, fever, rash, cough, tiredness and headaches. If your child appears sick before school, please keep them home. Germs love to be shared! Please teach your child the importance of good hand washing. This is the best way to prevent the spread of germs.

Immunizations are requirements that all schools must comply with according to NYS Law. Letters are being sent home if your child is delinquent for shots. If you receive notice that your child needed shots, this must be done ASAP. Your child may be excluded from school if this is not done.

Physicals are required by NYS for all students in Kindergarten (who were not in a district UPK program), 2nd grade and 4th grade and any student new to our district. A doctor's physical done in the past calendar year will meet this requirement. Call the clinic for a form if you did not receive one in the mail. Avoid the rush and call your doctor for an appointment. If we do not receive your child's physical form by 12/1/17, our nurse practitioner will perform a physical here in our clinic during the month of December.

The fall is the most common time of the year to start seeing head lice in children. Periodic lice checks will be done in school. Lice are a bother, but do not carry disease. They do not jump. If your child complains of their head itching, please check their hair for signs of lice. If you see lice, please treat your child's hair and notify the school nurse.

Health History forms were sent home in June. These are yearly forms. Please fill them out and return to school ASAP. We need the most current information for your child should they become ill in school.

REMEMBER...there are children in our school with food allergies. Please send in wrapped treats or non-food items if possible for classroom celebrations.

The main goal of the Niagara Street School clinic is to try to ensure the safety and well-being of your child when in school. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me.

Bus Transportation

If your child is a bus student and you don't want your child to take the bus home on a particular day, you are required to send in a note stating that your son/daughter will not be taking the bus on (date) only.

Also, every student will be dropped off at his or hers designated stop only, unless the bus company has sent us notification.

Again, "<u>no note</u>" and your child will be <u>automatically</u> placed on their bus.
