
## "Creative During Quarantine" Create Your Own Coat of Arms OPTIONAL Project



## Background Info:


During the Middle Ages, knights used a coat of arms to identify themselves in warfare. One man in armor looked a lot like another, so the coat of arms was used to identify a knight in battle. In Medieval times, only a few people could read and write, so pictures were very important. A coat of arms was like label for instant identification. You wanted to know instantly who was coming toward you, so you could know which side he was on. Coats of arms later became a way of showing membership in the aristocracy, after they lost their significance in warfare.

Only the oldest son would inherit his father's coat of arms unchanged; his younger brothers would usually add a symbol to show who they were. The symbol a younger son added was often a smaller picture placed in the middle of the shield. When a woman married, the coat of arms of her family was often added to her husband's arms. Sometimes the arms were divided into parts. In this case, the man's family coat of arms was in the upper left quarter (as you look at the coat of arms) and lower right, while the woman's family's arms were in the other two quarters. Shields are generally "read" like a book, starting at the upper left, going across and then down.

A coat of arms can have several parts. The main part is a shield, which can have a crest above it, a motto, and animals supporting the shield.

## How To Create Your Own Coat of Arms

Complete this at your own pace, without stress. Aim to complete this a little at a time by May 15, 2020.




<u>Step 1:</u> Choose a shield design. Use materials you have at home to draw and/or cut out a shield. You could use paper, cardboard, plasterboard, poster board, a pizza box... be creative!

<u>Step 2:</u> Choose four emblems for each section of your shield, which represent you. **BE CREATIVE!** Use different materials and methods such as construction paper, photographs, pictures from magazines, your own drawings, tin foil, etc. Be creative and **use resources you have right in your home**. Make your shield a representation of who you are, and make it as creative and interesting as you can!

<u>Step 3:</u> On a separate paper, write a paragraph explaining why you chose the emblems you chose, and what about you they represent. You should write a paragraph (at least 4 sentences) about each emblem you chose.

You can use any of these shapes for your Coat of Arms, or design your own!
