Letter Hopscotch

This large motor activity will help your child identify letters and/or their sounds. Write the letters of the alphabet on paper, using one piece of paper for each letter. To make a bean-bag, fill an old sock with some rice and tie at the end. Pick 5-7 letters and place them in a line or hopscotch grid on your floor. Give your child the bean bag and have them toss it onto a letter. Your child then jumps from letter to letter, stopping at the one where the bean bag is. The child then picks up the bean bag and has to identify the letter. As your child identifies the letters, switch them out with ones that have not been identified yet. If your child can identify all of the alphabet, have them say the sound the letter makes.

You can also play this game with numbers and/or shapes to support math skills.
