## **Course Description**

The students will acquire intermediate to advanced Spanish skills building on their foundations from Spanish 1 and 2. This course will focus on Interpretive, Interpersonal and Presentational Communication, as well as Relating Cultural Practices and Products to Perspectives, and Cultural Comparisons. The final examination will be the STAMP4s exam that will determine NYS Regents credit and can the stage for Spanish 4 and 5 and the NYS Seal of Biliteracy. We will thematically study the following units:

#### NYS Standards for World Language Learning

## **Grading Policy**

Your grade will be comprised of the following categories each marking period. Within these categories will be grades for the Interpretive Communication, Interpressonal Communication and Presentational Communication.

- Homework / Classwork / Participation / Behavior = 25%
- Quizzes and Activities = 25%
- Tests, Projects, IPAs = 50%

#### Absences

- Attendance is taken daily in class and is required in order to be successful in this class.
- If a student is absent for a test or quiz, it should be made up within a week of the original date.
- If an extended absence is necessary, it is advisable to contact guidance to obtain any materials.
- If a student is suspended either in-school or out-of-school, it is the student's responsibility to get any notes, assignments, etc. as it will be due on the day the student returns. This includes all tests and quizzes as well.

## **Course Expectations**

- Here are my expectations as your online teacher:
  - Be on time for class. You should be ready to work when the bell rings.
  - Be prepared with all of your materials every day.

- Do not touch anything on the teacher's desk or go behind the teacher's desk.
- Do not touch the Clear Touch board unless instructed to do so.
- The classroom phone is not for student use. Any phone calls or texts should be completed during passing time.
- Any negative behavior or disruption of education will result in minuses in participation as well as an official write up.
- Be respectful, kind and courteous to your classmates and teacher. Rudeness and inappropriate/vulgar language will not be tolerated in this classroom.
- Please do not wear any inappropriate clothing articles including offensive sayings, any head-gear, or any items that are against the NFCSD and/or NFHS Code of Conduct.

#### Course Expectations (continued)

- There will usually be a minimum of one week's notice for a unit test.
- Quizzes may be unannounced, or there may be one or two days notice.
- There will be homework every night based on what we do in class that day.
  Homework consists of what is assigned in class in addition to a mandatory
  15 minutes of review every night. The homework is to help you to know
  how you are doing with the material. Therefore, you must do it!
- You will keep your hands and other body parts to yourself.
- You will show the same respect for a substitute teacher, and do the work that is assigned as it is always left for you by the regular teacher. It will count for a grade.
- Do not line up at the door at the end of class. Stay in your seat until the bell rings and are dismissed by the teacher.

#### Course Expectations (continued)

- Food and beverages are strictly not permitted in the classroom. Only bottled water is appropriate for this classroom. Despite the fact that other beverages are sold in the school and on this floor, <u>only</u> water is permitted in this classroom.
- Gum chewing is permitted provided the teacher does not see it or hear it.
   One violation from any student will cause the entire class to lose the privilege.
- Recording of any session or use of my voice/image on your end is <u>strictly</u> <u>prohibited</u>.

#### THE FIVE P's

- Be PROMPT Be on time, enter the classroom quietly and sit in your assigned seat.
- Be PREPARED Have all of your materials with you every day.
- Be PRODUCTIVE Maximize learning time by staying on task, following directions and staying in your seat.
- <u>Be POLITE</u> Be nice or neutral to *everyone*. Swearing, teasing, talking back and bullying will not be tolerated. Respect yourself, your classmates, your teacher and your classroom.
- Be PATIENT Wait respectfully and calmly for your turn.
