

KidVision VPK Take Home Pages are tools to meaningfully and consistently teach Language, Communication, and Emergent Literacy skills to 4-year-olds.

When sitting with a child to complete a Take Home Page, follow these directions:

Name Letters

Write out the date at the top of the page, then write out the child's first and last name on the name line. The first letter of the date month and both names should be in upper case letters and the following letters should be lower case. Talk about each letter as you or the child writes it. Name the letters and ask the child to name the letters, with you and then alone.

Practice Listening Comprehension

Review Vocabulary

After watching the virtual field trip, ask children about new words they learned and what they mean. On the back of the Take Home Page, list four new words the child remembers from the field trip and talk more about them. When the child takes their Take Home Page home, parents can reinforce these new vocabulary words.

Practice Fine Motor & Emergent Writing Skills

Children color, draw, and write on the Take Home Pages, exercising their hand and finger muscles.

Improve Language, Communication, and Emergent Literacy

Each child's Take Home Pages will be different depending on their experience and ability. The important things are that children learn to recognize letters, listen to stories and answer questions, learn new vocabulary, and practice their fine motor skills.


