Frequently Asked Questions

- Do the Pre-K students follow the regular elementary school schedule? Yes, Pre-K children attend school from 8:45 am - 3:00 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
- <u>Is busing provided</u>? No, families are responsible for getting their children to and from school daily.
- Is Pre-K offered at every elementary school in the District? Yes, all 8 elementary schools have Pre-K classes.
- <u>Can I select the school my child will attend</u>? Yes, the District's Pre-K registration process allows families to select the school that their child attends. Parents are encouraged to consider the school closest to their home, as transportation is <u>not</u> provided.
- <u>Will my child be refused entry into the program if she/he is not fully toilet</u> <u>trained</u>? No, however families and teachers will work in partnership to build independent personal care skills in all children.
- English is not our first language; will my child still be permitted to attend the Pre-K program? Yes, emersion in the English Language and exposure to rich vocabulary is a goal for all students attending the program.
- <u>Will Special Education services be offered to Pre-K students</u>? The Committee on Special Education will follow the appropriate steps and processes to ensure that all students receive the services that they are entitled to receive.
- <u>Can Pre-K children attend before and after school programming</u>? No, before and after school childcare is offered to children in Kindergarten 6th grades.
- If my child attends the District's Pre-K 3 program, will he/she automatically be assigned to a Pre-K 4 class? Yes, all Pre-K 3 students are assigned to Pre -K 4 classrooms. Families are not required to complete the registration process again.
